H&SC Revision Trip

Our Year 11 Health and Social Care students enjoyed participating at the Revision Grade Booster Event in Birmingham. This was a full day of engaged learning with workshops designed and delivered by experienced presenters.

From taking part in revision activities to winning prizes against other schools, it was an unforgettable day! The students have shown real dedication to their studies and Miss Godfrey couldn't be prouder! Well done everyone!!

Science week

This year's theme for British Science Week was "Time" and students in Year 7 and 8 spent their science lessons during British Science Week carrying out activities centred around the idea of time. Students modelled bioaccumulation through food chains by taking on the roles of different animals, collecting 'food tokens' from around the class and passing these tokens on when they were eaten. This enabled them to see how chemicals can build up in food chains over time and be passed on through food. We also spoke about how this is currently happening with microplastics in humans! Students also conducted research and made display work based on the history of the Universe, stretching all the way back to the Big Bang all the way up to the modern day! And students also looked at how we measure time, and how this has changed over the years. Students were then challenged with making a timer that would last for 30 seconds – and then evaluating why we don't rely on these methods today!









The Royal Society

On the 6th March our Sixth Form students presented their work on an on-going project at the Royal Society in London. Students are monitoring the conditions of the balancing pond on the school site, which is home to a population of great crested newts. To examine the biological matter in the pond water, lasers are being used to examine cells in a technique called flow cytometry. The day consisted of talks from Professor Saiful Islam and the archives team, as well as presentation workshops. The students then spent the afternoon presenting their work to the other schools attending and to scientists, guests and Fellows of the Royal Society. It is a huge honour to be invited to the Royal Society and our students were such a credit to the school that we have even been invited to present again at the summer exhibition in July 2024! A huge well done.

The Bridge officially opened at the start of the Spring Term when we welcomed our first students! Our purpose-built provision enables young people with Autism to experience the quality education that Moulton School has to offer within a nurturing environment adapted to their needs. Our students have adapted phenomenally well to their new school; making new friends and learning 'The Moulton Way'.

Successes over this first term include:

- Developing narrative writing skills in English.
- Exploring refraction and reflection of light during science, and extracting DNA from peas, plus making our own DNA structures from sweets
- Our Year 10 student embarking upon his GCSE option courses in conjunction with main school – what a talented artist he is!
- Our first parent coffee morning where students catered for the event.

Students in our two classes have accrued an impressive 1000 Aspire points over this term, demonstrating their dedication to their studies and application of our 'ASPIRE' ethos.

Sports News

A successful term with lots of great results. Congratulations to our girls U13 Indoor cricket county champions and our U13 boys, U15 girls and U15 boys who all finished in 3rd place. Our Year 8 dodgeball team are also now County champions after beating Bishop Stopford 4–3 in the final.
