
Disneyland Trip

History

This term we invited a company called Frontline History into school to deliver a workshop covering the content related to the History GCSE on WWI.

The presenters David Allton and Richard Townsley, are an authentically-uniformed Regimental Medical Officer and Royal Army Medical Corps Orderly. They guided students, through a hands-on experience using authentic artefacts, role-play activities, and carefully chosen period images and film. Students had to act out the role of an injured soldier and try their might as stretcher bearers - much harder than it seemed, even without the mud of No Man's Land.

Other students volunteered their services as models for the different gas masks developed during WWI. This session really brought their studies to life as they saw and handled artefacts they had only previously read about in books.









Debating Event

A group of year 12 students attended the inaugural West Northamptonshire County Debating Event at the County Hall on along with 7 other local schools. Our students attend the Sixth form Debating Society but were new to this event.

We did amazingly, winning 3 debates to reach the final before losing out on a controversial shared vote to finish runners-up. Congratulations to all involved.









Drama Trip

As part of our enrichment programme in drama, we took our year 9 students to the Harry Potter Studio Tour, London for a 'behind the scenes' costume distressing workshop and a full magical tour of the incredible studios.







Geography Fieldtrip

Year 11 braved the early start for their coach ride to Epping Forest to study rivers. The students carried out fieldwork to investigate how and why river characteristics change as you go downstream. A highlight was the hands-on experiment at Debden Brook, where students measured water flow and analysed sediment, bringing their classroom learning to life. This enables pupils to explore the interactions between human and physical influences in impacting river environments and river discharge.





Sports News

Contrasting results for our football teams in the County Cup, with Year 10 and 11 both drawn against Magdalen. Year 11 unluckily losing out in the last minute against the run of play but Year 10 going through to the last 4 with a 3-0 win. Year 7 and 9 also progressed through to the next round.

Away from football, our year 11 boys badminton team put on a brilliant performance to become runners up in the County competition, while our year 8 boys dodgeball team won the district competition and go through to the county finals. Our year 8 boys have also played their first games in a Junior NBA competition where we have been linked with the Memphis Grizzlies Basketball team.

Girls sport continues to expand with increasing numbers of girls playing for sports teams. Both U13 girls and U15 girls won the Saints Schools Hockey tournament and have been busy in other competitions. The U15 futsal team and Indoor cricket team both got to the final of their district cups while the U13s won the Indoor cricket and won their game in the National cup.
